

UW Transfer Student Guide

- Are you transferring to UW with an associate's degree from a community college? Do you have at least a 3.4 transfer GPA? Then you may be eligible to receive the UW Transfer Award! Incoming resident, out of state (excluding Nebraska residents), and international students who don't qualify for the WUE are eligible for this \$1,000 annual award. No scholarship application necessary!
- Have you found a place to live yet? The residence halls are always an option. However, UW also has four apartment complexes: Bison Run, River Village, Spanish Walk and Landmark Village. The UW apartments are fully furnished, and transportation to campus is easier than ever with the Campus Commuter shuttle.
- UW Transit and Parking Services make transportation easy, even if you're living off-campus. Visit uwo.transloc.com to track the busses in real-time and find where the bus stops are located. For night and weekend transportation, there's SafeRide and LaramieLink Dial-A-Ride.
- To get into UW sporting events and other activities, you'll need to download the free Wild Bunch app on your smartphone. To register, you'll be asked to enter your student ID and UW email address. The app also has a schedule of upcoming events and gives you opportunities to win prizes.
